COMPLETE SENTENCES

A sentence is a group of words that tells a complete thought.

It starts with a capital letter and ends with a punctuation mark. Every sentence has a **SUBJECT**, whom or what the sentence is about and a **PREDICATE** that tells what the subject does or is.

SIMPLE AND COMPLETE

Simple Subject:

The most important word in the subject.

<u>Complete Subject:</u>

Includes all the words that tell whom or what the sentence is about. <u>Simple Predicate:</u>

The most important word in the predicate

<u>Complete Predicate:</u>

All the words that tell what the subject does or is.
