VERBS

Verbs are words that describe actions.

<u>Verb Tenses BrainPop</u>

PRESENT TENSE VERBS

<u>Present Tense Verbs</u> show action that happens NOW.

Most present tense singular verbs end with -s or -es.

Most present tense plural verbs do not end with -s or -es

Example:

The king <u>enters</u> the hall.

His subjects bow.

We <u>live</u> in Alabama.

PRESENT TENSE VERBS

<u>Present Tense Verbs</u> show action that happens NOW.

Most present tense singular verbs end with -s or -es.

Most present tense plural verbs do not end with -s or -es

Examples:

You plan
He eats
They marry
It flies
She hopes
We smile
I give

PAST TENSE VERBS

Verbs in the past tense show action that has already happened.

Most verbs in the past tense end in -ed

Example:

Long ago, a fairy enchanted the princess.

Last year, the club **performed** a musical.

I sang along with them for practice.

PAST TENSE VERBS

Verbs in the past tense show action that has already happened.

Most verbs in the past tense end in -ed

Example:

You planned

He ate

They married

: It flew

She hoped

We smiled

I gave

FUTURE TENSE VERBS

Verbs in the Future tense show action that will happen.

Add will, (or shall) to most verbs to show the future tense.

Example:

She will sleep now.

I will be a pilot someday.

John will fly to the beach this summer.

FUTURE TENSE VERBS

Verbs in the Future tense show action that will happen.

Add will, (or shall) to most verbs to show the future tense.

Example:

You will plan
He will eat
They will be married
She will hope
We will smile
I will give

DIFFERENT VERB TENSES

Tense	Meaning	Example
present	now	l run.
past	before now	l ran.
future	after now	l will run.
present perfect	begun in the past and recently finished or still going on	I have run.
past perfect	finished in the past before some other past action	I had run.
future perfect	finished in the future before some other future action	I will have run.
